Greetings from the Secretariat,

It is my pleasure to present to you the 78th issue of the SPREP-Tok e-newsletter for the month of August 2021.

In this issue, we highlight the outstanding achievement by one of our Member countries, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, who are now working on updating their 2016 State of Environment report. The report provides a status of the environment, helping policy and decision makers make informed decisions when it comes to environmental impact. RMI started its multi-sector consultation in August to review data already collected and to identify gaps, and I would like to commend the government of RMI and its stakeholders for taking initiative and ensuring that development is not at the expense of sustainability.

August also saw the release of the Sixth Assessment Report by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change. The report paints a bleak picture and does not bode well for future generations, reinforcing the message that urgent changes must be made to limit global warming while there is still time. During this time, we also conducted a ManaClass for Pacific media, to help them better understand and interpret the Report, so they can use the data in their stories. Over 20 participants attended this ManaClass, and I would like to thank them all for taking the time to join us, as the issue of climate change is of utmost importance to our region.


